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Source Protection Committee Meeting
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Land use planning decisions in Ontario

Decisions shall “conform with”

- Significant threat policies and designated Great Lakes policies in approved source protection plans (CWA – Section 39)

“shall conform with”

- Comply with standard
- Provides little flexibility

Decisions shall “have regard to”

Other policies in the approved source protection plan, including policies that:

- Address moderate and low drinking water threats;
- Govern monitoring
- Deal with the Great Lakes

(CWA – Section 39)

“shall have regard to”

- Warrants an assessment
- Should consider policy unless there are good reasons not to
- Provides flexibility
