RE: Draft Policies – Chemicals (Fuel, DNAPLs, Organic Solvents), Road Salt, Non-Agricultural Source Material, and Updates to General Policies

Draft policy wordings to address the significant drinking water threats related to fuel, dense non-aqueous phase liquid (DNAPLs), organic solvents, non-agricultural source material, and road salt have been reviewed by the municipal working groups. Further, the “general provisions” policies related to the delivery of education and outreach programs have been updated based on feedback received from the June Source Protection Committee meeting municipal working groups. Lastly, a new general provisions policy has been drafted to reflect the lack of comfort with the Section 59 Restricted Land Use Policies.

The intent, rationale, policy text, and any outstanding issues related to these policies are attached in four groups:

- 1) Updates to general policy wordings (only the two updated policies are attached)
- 2) Policies related to chemicals. The activities addressed by the chemical policies include the following:
 - Handling and storage of a dense non-aqueous phase liquid
 - Handling and storage of an organic solvent
 - Handling and storage of fuel
- 3) Policies related to non-agricultural source material. The activities addressed by these policies include:
 - Handling and storage of non-agricultural source material
 - Application of non-agricultural source material
- 4) Policies related to road salt. The activities addressed by these policies include:
 - Handling and storage of road salt
 - Application of road salt
