


Crystal Springs

Municipal Wellhead Protection Area

The *Clean Water Act* was developed to protect municipal, residential drinking water sources across the province from contamination and/or overuse by ensuring policies are in place to manage activities that may pose a drinking water. Locally, these policies are included in the Trent Source Protection Plan and they apply within the red shaded area shown below.





The Crystal Springs Municipal Well System is one of 53 municipal, residential drinking water systems in the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region that is protected under the Clean Water Act and is 1 of 12 systems in the Otonabee-Peterborough Source Protection Area.

- ✓ Waste disposal and sewage systems
- ✓ Livestock grazing, pasturing, confinement
- ✓ Road salt use and snow storage
- ✓ Spreading or storing of agricultural materials (e.g. manure)
