


## Lakefield

Municipal Intake Protection Zone

The *Clean Water Act* was developed to protect municipal, residential drinking water sources across the province from contamination and/or overuse by ensuring policies are in place to manage activities that may pose a drinking water threat. Locally, these policies are included in the Trent Source Protection Plan and they apply within the red shaded area shown below.

The Lakefield Municipal Surface Water System is one of 53 municipal, residential drinking water systems in the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region that is protected under the *Clean Water Act* and is 1 of 12 such systems in the Otonabee-Peterborough Source Protection Area.

Serviced Population	3,100 (approximately)
Annual Pump Rate	1,547 m³/ day (average)
Depth of Intake Pipe	2 m (approximately)
Intake Classification Type	Type D (affected by a water impoundment structure)
Treatment System	Full conventional treatment process (coagulation, flocculation, sedimentation, filtration, and disinfection

## Activities that can pose a Threat to the municipal drinking water source



- ✓ Waste disposal and sewage systems
- ✓ Livestock grazing, pasturing, confinement
- ✓ Road salt use and snow storage
- ✓ Spreading or storing of agricultural materials (e.g. manure)
- ✓ Pesticide and fertilizer storage and use
- ✓ Liquid fuel storage (e.g. home heating oil)
- ✓ Chemical handling and storage
